# **Hong Kong**

The beginning of the program will take place in Hong Kong, the city with the largest number of English speaking scholars in Chinese Studies. The Program will take place at Chung Chi College of The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), a key supporting partner to this Program. CUHK is a public research university in Shatin, Hong Kong, formally established in 1963 by a charter granted by the Legislative Council of Hong Kong.





# Macau

Macau is an important part of Greater China, and its significance will be introduced. One of the highlights in our Macau session lies in the visit to University of Macau, the only public comprehensive university leading the academia of Macau.

It is also a strategic location for Portuguese speaking countries in Europe, Africa and South America. Therefore, an important partner for our program.





# **Taiwan**

In Taiwan, many authentic traditional customs, beliefs, and institutions have been preserved. Participants will be introduced to meditation and training methodologies of the Buddhist and Daoist disciplines.

During the Taiwan session, lectures and Daoist practice sessions will be held at National Taiwan University (NTU), national coeducational research university. NTU is considered the most prestigious university in Taiwan. Buddhist rituals and practice sessions will be held at Tian Nan Temple, Fagu Mountain.






# Beijing

The last part of the program will be held at Peking University in Beijing, the capital of China. The responses to the challenges of Buddhism and various other religious influences as well as the process of meeting the West in contemporary China will be introduced.

Peking University is a major Chinese research university and a member of the C9 League. It was founded in 1898 as a replacement of the ancient Taixue or Guozijian (Imperial Academy).

In Beijing we will also participate in the 24<sup>th</sup> World Congress of Philosophy, which will take place at the China National Convention Center, 13-20 August 2018.





# Beijing

# 13 – 20 August, 2018

The World Congress of Philosophy is organized every five years by the International Federation of Philosophical Societies (FISP) in collaboration with one of its member societies. The XXIV World Congress will be held in Beijing, China, from 13 to 20 August, 2018, under the auspices of the Chinese Organizing Committee of Peking University. The complementary aims of the 2018 Congress include an emphasis on exploring the dimensions of the human spirit and inquiring into the challenges facing humanity.

The 2018 Greater China Program aligns with the 24<sup>th</sup> World Congress of Philosophy in Beijing in 2018. Professional development in this program is specifically designed to help overseas (non-Chinese national) students, lecturers and professors to become familiar with Chinese studies in order to prepare for this landmark event.

#### **SDCF Invited Sessions**

Select past and present SDCF program participants will present their papers within the SDCF invited session "Confucian Self-cultivation as a Path Towards 'Being Human' - Conceptions Related to National, Global, and Human Security" at the XXIV World Congress of Philosophy – the direct outcome of SDCF's commitment to advanced scholarship. Participants will also attend the invited session on Dunhuang, jointly organised by CATL (China Academy of Translation) and SDCF.

# **Dunhuang**

Meeting Point of Cultural Exchange Along the Silk Road

敦煌——絲綢之路重鎮的跨文化傳播

Dunhuang occupied a pivotal position between East and West along the Silk Road. The session aims to present different aspects of science and technology, multi-lingual texts and their translation, as well as the historical and social elements that can be inferred from the study of artefacts and manuscripts related to Dunhuang, a major centre for the exchange of skills, knowledge and ideas in the past, and one of the most dynamic hubs of civilization.

Three panels have been established with interconnecting themes:

- 1) Inheritance and Protection of Historical and Cultural Heritage in Dunhuang from the Perspective of Science and Technology
- 2) Translation and Communication of Dunhuang Culture
- 3) Historical and Social Interpretations of Dunhuang's Cultural Heritage

These topics are essential for the understanding and appreciation of the Belt and Road Initiative by illuminating key multi-cultural exchanges taking place in this geographic location, and will contribute to trade, collaborations and other exchanges in the further development of the Initiative in this world of globalisation. Most essentially, the Dunhuang heritage will be preserved and digitised for the benefit of future generations.







# The concept of fa in pre-Qin thought from the cosmological, social and political point of view

Pre-Qin thinkers belong to the diverse schools - so called the Hundred Schools of thought (baijia zhengming 百家争鸣) that developed many different ideological traditions - discussing which had to be the best way to rule a State. Therefore the matter of law (fa法) was one of their most important topics.

Among these schools, Legalists and Confucianists' main concern was how a sage king had to rule: it was better rule a State with li (rites, rituals, manners) or with fa (law)?But what exactly those thinkers meant for fa? And on what extent Pre-Qin thinkers concept of fa influenced the political theory of the dynasties thereafter?

This is the main topic of our project, which is to discuss the concept of fa from different perspectives and discuss how the thinkers of different schools of thought of the pre-Qin period influenced the idea of law of the dynasties thereafter.

# Art as a tool for moral-cultivation & Artisan's tools

The study investigate an intersection between arts and ethics from a Confucian perspective of moral cultivation. Confucius addresses the issue of artistic development emphasizing its importance as a process of moral cultivation or becoming a human. Eric C. Mullis remarks: "practicing an art is necessarily a moral affair as it entails transforming the self, finding a place within a tradition, and otherwise entering into significant relationships with others".

# **Developed Project for Returnee**

While it is possible to analyze Chinese philosophy and Chinese spirit from different angles, one of the most fruitful unorthodox methods is to turn to weigi, an ancient Chinese board game. Games are the first models of the surrounding world, society and relations between its members, and contain certain values cherished by a particular civilization. Thus, games may be used as an model, or even a conceptual analogical framework, to analyze philosophy and genius of their parent culture. This paper seeks to present the possibility of such an analysis, and researches into ontological, social, geopolitical and IR-related aspects of the game of weigi.
