CUHK is a public research university in Shatin, Hong Kong, formally established in 1963 by a charter granted by the Legislative Council of Hong Kong.






2019 SUMMER PROGRAM LOCATIONS

Beijing

The third part of the program will be held at Peking University in Beijing, the capital of China. The responses to the challenges of Taoism and various other religious influences will be introduced.

Peking University is a major Chinese research university and a member of the C9 League. It was founded in 1898 as a replacement of the ancient Taixue or Guozijian (Imperial Academy).





2019 SUMMER PROGRAM LOCATIONS

Dunhuang

Dunhuang, a desert city in Gansu Province, occupied a pivotal position between East and West along the Silk Road. Dunhuang was added as a new location after the success of "Dunhuang: Meeting Point of Cultural Exchange Along the Silk Road", SDCF joint session with the China Academy of Translation (CATL) at the XXIV World Congress of Philosophy in Beijing (15 August 2018). SDCF and CATL agreed to further explore the rich cultural heritage of Dunhuang by holding a second international bilingual (English-Chinese) conference on the topic.



My main academic interest is in the intersection between analytic philosophy and phenomenology especially in respect to the self and science. My focus is on the significance of each individual self as the source of all knowledge. In my PhD dissertation I have two comparative sections in which I consider how the basic idea of the self as the source of our first-person perspective is not necessarily inconsistent with Buddhist no-self views and the Confucian relational person idea. 

The Role of Ritual (*Li*) in the Production of Virtue (*Ren*)

This paper aims to analyze an intrinsic connection between the Confucian ritual and the core value of the Ru school, virtue. The first part explores the peculiarities of ren generation as seen in the Analects, the core of Confucianism. In the second part, another important Confucian source, the Odes, are investigated. The third part enters the domain of comparative philosophy in an attempt to analyze ren in the context of Bildung in John McDowell's neo-Aristotelean epistemology. Finally, the last part deals with the notions of li and ren as key factors in China's economic surge.

Political Philosophy of New Confucianism

This paper compares ideas in classical Confucianism with ideas proposed by contemporary Confucians on four topics in political philosophy: nationalism, meritocracy, economics, and justice. The purpose of the comparison is to make clear which ideas can be found in the classics and which have been added by contemporary thinkers. The first section tries to delimit the framework of "culture" and "nationalism" conceptually and looking for its philosophical parameters in classical Confucianism. In this context, it reviews its conceptual variations in the new Confucianism and reflects on their results.

The second section focuses on meritocracy. It argues that the kind of meritocracy put forthby many contemporary Confucian thinkers has thin textual support in the texts of classical Confucianism. Classical Confucians, this paper argues, were not meritocrats. While they proposed that rulers and government officers should be virtuous and able people, they never called for rulers and government officers to be selected on the basis of virtue and ability.

The third section is focused in the economic area. Up to now, economic aspect in China is influenced by the ideologies of Confucianism. Finally, the fourth section is about the concept of justice (zhengyi). New Confucianism is developing the concept of justice, making it more practical and suitable for modern and civil society.

The Concept of Good Life in Early Chinese Thought

At all times people wanted to live well, to be happy and enjoy a good life. But what does "the good life" mean? People's opinions have always differed on what should be the key criteria for "the good life". Some try to answer this question from a hedonistic point of view, advocating the necessity of experiencing pleasure. Some apply a materialistic approach to achieve happiness in life. Some put the moral virtuousness in the centre of the concept of "the good life". No matter what you choose, there is no right or wrong definition of the concept of "the good life". This papers is focused on the understanding of "the good life" in early Chinese thought. We start from Mencius's understanding of "the good life", proceeding to another Confucian thinker, Xunzi, whose idea of innate human nature was opposite to that of Mencius. Finally, we discuss the Daoist understanding of "the good life" represented by Laozi and Zhuangzi.

Qing and Self-Cultivation in Ancient Chinese Thought: A Comparative Study of Ruism, Daoism and Chan Buddhism

Qing 情 is an important concept that has been discussed throughout the Chinese philosophical tradition. In this regard, the ethical status of emotions has been particularly scrutinised. In this paper, we would like to concentrate on the early Chinese thought in order to decipher its possible understanding(s). Self-cultivation will serve as our guideline to achieve this goal from a consistent perspective. We will look at qing from a triple perspective: Ruism, with a particular focus on the Xunzi, Daoism, through the reference to the Zhuangzi, and Chan Buddhism from the Platform Sutra. These three directions are relevant in the sense they have inspired and challenged each other over time. The overall purpose of our research is to demonstrate the significance of qing. In addition, we want to show that the evolution of its understanding by Confucian, Daoist and Buddhist scholars embodies idiosyncratic aspects of the Chinese thought.
